Bishop Robert Jackson is a native of Gray, GA, but later moved to Macon, GA. Since 1955, he has been happily married to GA State Mother Josephine Jackson, who brought him to the Lord. After they were married, she became saved and sanctified. Not knowing that she was going to church because she loved the Lord, he followed her to church one night and discovered that the other man in her life was Jesus Christ. They have one child.

For several years, he worked at Peach State as a professional truck driver. Also he once owned and operated a restaurant in Sandersville, GA.

In 1956, Bishop Jackson was called into the ministry. However, he did not start preaching until 1957. Under the auspices of the late Bishop P.J. Welch of Healing Temple Ministries, Inc., he pastored churches in Milledgeville and Sandersville, GA. Subsequently, he joined Bell's Temple A.O.H. Church of God under the leadership of Bishop L.M. Bell in Macon, GA. In 1975, Bishop Bell sent him to pastor Forsyth A.O.H. Church of God (now known as Powerhouse Apostolic Church of Promise) in Forsyth, GA. Bishop Jackson became an ordained elder about 1995, an overseer around 1999, and an Executive Board member in 2002. After the split in the A.O.H. Church of God, he helped to found the Apostolic Church of Promise in 2002. After being set aside for two years as a bishop-elect, he was consecrated as a bishop in 2017.

Bishop Jackson currently serves as the Assistant National Presider, President of the National Executive Board, diocesan bishop of the Middle Georgia Diocese, Supervisory Bishop of the National Public Relations Department, member of the Board of Bishops, and pastor of Powerhouse Apostolic Church of Promise in Forsyth, GA.
